This Project will allow for these important stories and lived experiences to be documented and shared in the spirit of openness, reconciliation, and education.

This Project is a growing partnership between cultural and educational institutions across Northwestern Ontario who together, are facilitating the creation of a travelling exhibit focused on the history and stories of Indigenous Veterans.

Inspired by a 2018 exhibit co-curated by members of our Project Team, this innovative project, supported by the Museums Assistance Program (MAP) and the Future Generations Foundation (FGF), aims to establish lasting partnerships with Indigenous communities and organizations to collectively document and share the untold stories of Indigenous veterans across NWO.
